POLICE SEEK PUBLIC ASSISTANCE IN IDENTIFYING SUSPECTS FROM BURGLARY AND UNAUTHORIZED ENTRY OF PROPERTY CASES

On Sunday, December 18, 2011 at approximately 0820 hours the Lakeport Police Department was dispatched to the 400 block of Campbell Ln. to investigate a burglary at Borges Logging after an observant citizen saw two suspicious male subjects at the property.

Police met with the business owner and found that locks on the property gate and buildings had been cut and the buildings entered with property removed from them. Police believe that the two male subjects had been on the property for at least an hour and were in the process of removing items from buildings to be loaded into a vehicle when they were spotted by the citizen.

A majority of the property, including tools and equipment, was recovered at the scene after the subjects fled the area. Police have located evidence which we believe may assist in the identification of the vehicle and suspects who are described as: 1-White male adult 20-25 years old, approximately 6 feet tall, 170-180 pounds, clean shaven with sideburns and wearing a black beanie cap, dark colored sweatshirt and dark colored pants. 2. White male adult 20-25 years old, thin build, unshaven with reddish colored stubble, a groove between his two upper front teeth, a tongue ring and wearing a dark green beanie cap. Vehicle is described as a late model white sedan, possibly a Chevrolet Impala or Buick.

On Monday, December 19, 2011 at approximately 0330 hours the Lakeport Police Department was dispatched to the 1900 block of Alden Ave. to investigate the report of suspicious adult male subjects prowling around a residence. The subjects fled in a vehicle prior to police arrival. The vehicle was described as a dark colored, possibly maroon, compact to mid size sedan.

The department is continuing to investigate the above incidents and do not know if they are related. Anyone with information is asked to contact the department.
