TRAFFIC SAFETY ADVISORY COMMITTEE AGENDA

Monday, June 3, 2019

1. **CALL TO ORDER**

Chair Dollosso opened the meeting at 4:03 p.m. with Committee members Barrett, Dollosso, and Maxman present and Committee members Brown and Cole absent. Staff present: Community Development Director Ingram and City Clerk Buendia.

2. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

A motion was made by Committee member Barrett, seconded by Committee member Maxman, and unanimously carried by voice vote, to approve the Minutes of March 11, 2019. Committee members Brown and Cole absent.

3. **CITIZEN INPUT**

Bill Graham addressed the repairs made to Lakeshore Blvd last summer the striping doesn't indicate bike lane and vehicles are parking in the bike lane.

Suzanne Lyons supplied pictures of a recent accident on Lakeshore Boulevard. The driver was headed south, didn't negotiate the curve and went through a chain linked fence. Ms. Lyons asked to have Lakeshore safety issues placed on an upcoming agenda.

Nicole Wagner spoke about the danger for pedestrians walking on Lakeshore Boulevard. She stated that it was her fence that was damaged in the accident.

4. **DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS**
 - A. Right-of-Way Nuisance Management Program

Community Development Director Ingram and Permit Specialist Sharp provided an update on enforcement of vegetation nuisances in city right-of-way.

 - B. Eleventh Street Corridor Feasibility Study Update

Community Development Director Ingram provided an update on the status of the Eleventh Street Corridor Feasibility Study and the community outreach meetings; the need for additional right-of-way to address pedestrian and auto safety issues; and the long-term planning necessary to address the problems.

Suzanne Lyons commented on the community outreach meeting for the study.

 - C. Lake County Pedestrian Needs Study Project Update

Community Development Director Ingram gave a staff report. Mr. Ingram and the TSAC reviewed in detail the identified priority pedestrian improvement projects for the City of Lakeport from the study.

Suzanne Lyons asked questions of staff and relayed her preferences for walk-ability on Lakeshore Boulevard.

Mr. Ingram stated that he wanted to ensure that the top ten

priorities were in line with TSAC priorities and the TSAC did not provide changes to the top ten project priorities listed in the study.

D. Biannual Review of Traffic Safety Related Complaints

Community Development Director Ingram reported on the traffic safety related complaints to the City of Lakeport within the last six months and the resolution to those complaints.

5. **GENERAL TRAFFIC ITEMS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS**

Chair Dollosso asked for an update regarding the two hour parking near Sanducci's and asked about street sweeping on 11th Street where there is gravel in the center lane.

Committee member Barrett also requested street sweeping on Lakeshore Boulevard.

Committee member Maxman reported an issue with the striping on Russell at Second Street.
